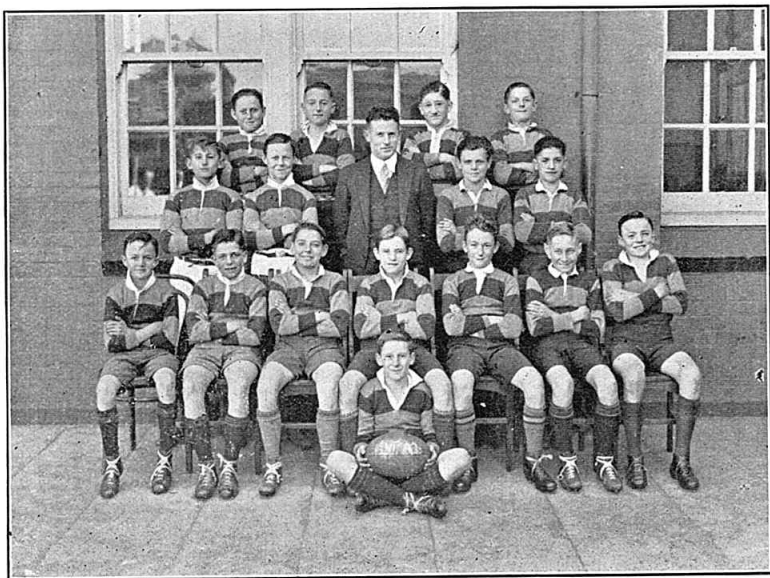




6st. 3lbs. "A" TEAM—WINNERS OF COMPETITION.

Hoppie as skipper! Next year we expect to hear more about Miller, D. Randall, Haynes, Reeves and Ross.

Principal point scorers for the "A" team: Massey 23, Alexander 21, Clark 21, Slarks 18, Johnson 17, Cox 15, Symes 15.

In competition matches the "B" team scored 24 points, as against 90 scored by their opponents and in non-competition games, 32 points to 6.

A colour competition under 6st. 3lbs., was run, teams entering from second year, 1B, 1A and 1C.

This competition was finally won by second year, with 1B runners-up. At the end of the season, all these teams were very even and 1A are to be congratulated on their marked improvement.

A combined team played the 6st. 3lbs. "B" team, and were only defeated 3 to nil, though they were on the defence from start to finish.

Promising players were Elliott and Thomas (second year), Crockett, Armstrong and Smith.

During the season Fifth year played two matches.

The first of these was against a combined team consisting of nine members of the staff assisted by seven members of the lower years. Fifth year won a hard game by 16-9, a fine performance in view of the fact that their opponents fielded 30 men against 15. No, our mathematics are quite correct.

Mr. Austin, after some minutes spent in emulating "Strangler" Lewis, picked up in the ruck and sent to Whyte who scored. Mr. McCaffrey tried to take the kick, but Mr. Henry meanly put it on the ground to be charged down by Charge.

At this period of the game, Mr. Ford was displaying great vigour, and skilful ju-jitsu tactics which resulted in one of his opponents losing part of his ear and another his big toe.

After some 90 minutes strenuous play, the half time whistle went. Combined team 6-0.

After an interval of 20 minutes, occasioned by Mr. Austin having borrowed the referee's whistle in order to produce wind in his favour, the game was resumed.

Some of the snap had gone out of the Masters by this time, though Mr. Austin was still showing vigour and plenty of knee, the latter being due in part to the exiguity of his shorts, while Mr. Woolf was still tackling well. Mr. Gillings was fox trotting with grace and brilliance, and Mr. Golding was keeping Bennett in check.

Fifth year, however, kept pressing and T. Penny scored, Bruce converting. Then Hannel emerged victor from his long contest with Mr. Woolf and crossed. The kick failed. Fifth year 8-6.

Thanks to Mr. Golding's resource, Cohen was able to secure from a scrum and the ball went to Mr. Henry, to Mr. McCaffrey, to Hills, who scored. The kick again failed. Combined team 9-8.

Condition now began to tell, and though Mr. Golding still showed flashes of his former form, the game swung definitely in favour of fifth year. Charge scored and Bruce converted and just on time another try was scored, leaving them victors, 16-9.

The outstanding players for the combined team were Mr. Golding and Mr. Golding, to 15 terms.

The match against fourth year produced a still keener struggle, fifth year only winning 13-11. At half time the scores were 11-0 in favour of fourth year (who had been playing football while their opponents talked) Peate scoring three tries, one converted by Hogan.

In the second half fifth year played football, while 13 of fourth year talked, and the firm of Williams and Williams moaned. Tries were scored for fifth year by Atkins, Penny and Longworth.

ATHLETICS.

The Twenty-four Annual Athletic Meeting was held on Wednesday and Thursday, August 20th and 21st, at Sports Ground No. 1.

In many ways, this year's meeting was not so successful as those of previous years.

It was the first meeting held without the girls, who in previous years had contributed greatly to the success of the day. Further, the weather conditions on Thursday were unpleasant, overcast skies and a bleak, biting wind.

These two factors tended to diminish the attendance as compared with previous meetings.

Lastly, the programme was overloaded with novelty events.

The standard of performances, however, was most gratifying, particularly in the senior section, where they were appreciably better than in any previous year except 1923.

In all, four records were broken. The best performance was that of A. Freeman in the broad jump. His winning effort was 21ft. 9½ins., one inch better than the then existing C.H.S. record held by Ashbarry, of S.H.S. Further, S. Freeman, with 21ft. 5½in., and Harvey with 21ft. 1½in. showed form worthy of any combined meeting.

In the senior hop, step and jump, MacLeod, by clearing 41ft. 10½ins., beat Punton's record by over a foot.

In the under fourteen hop, step and jump H. Spark created new figures by clearing 35ft. 9½ins., a phenomenal effort for a boy of his age. Spark also won the under fourteen running broad jump, standing broad jump, 100 yards and 220 yards. Hills created new figures in his heat of the senior 220 yards which he won in 23 4/5 secs. Though he was successful in winning the final from Hawkes and S. Freeman, his time suffered owing to the severe head wind encountered at the finish. Hills also won the 440 yards in 57 2/5 and the 880 yards in 2.17 1/5 sec. Hawkes won his heat of the 100 yards in 10 3/5 secs., and the final in 11 secs., showing excellent form and a promise which he fulfilled in Sydney.

The mile fell to F. Luckham, the hurdles to Waters and the senior pole vault to C. Nelson. In the high jump, S. Freeman, Harvey and Symes tied for first place at 5ft. 4½in.

The Senior Cup was won by Hills with 20 points. S. Freeman 19 points being second and A. Freeman 14½ points third.

The juniors were generally unimpressive. S. Cohen won the junior cup with two points more than Rudd.

The under fourteen cup was won easily by Sparks, whose performances have already been mentioned.

The officials under Mr. Walker, performed their duties ably, and a heavy programme was carried through in a most satisfactory manner.

C.H.S. SPORTS.

These were held at the Sydney Cricket Ground, on September 2nd and 3rd, and our congratulations are due to Sydney High School, who won the senior competition by an immense margin.

Our representatives secured fourth place behind Parramatta and Cessnock, and acquitted themselves most creditably.

Hawkes, after winning his heat in the 100 yards in 10 3/5, got away badly in the final, but even so finished second to Ashbarry, on whom he was gaining at the finish.

Hills failed to gain a place in the final of the 220 yards, but ran fourth in the 440 yards, which was won in 52½secs.

Waters finished fourth in the final of the 120 yards hurdles.

S. Freeman, taking the place of Harvey, who had strained his leg, gained fifth place in the high jump.

A. Freeman gained second place in the broad jump, clearing 21ft. 7ins., an effort which would have won easily in any year except the last two.

Our medley relay team were eliminated in their heat, but the circular relay team comprising Hawkes, Hills, S. Freeman and A. Freeman gained third place in the final.

Our juniors were outclassed and failed to gain a single point.

In the under fourteen section, Spark won his heat of the 100 yards in 12 secs., but was unplaced in the final.

In the final of the 220 yards he ran fourth, gaining our only points in this division.

BASEBALL NOTES.

A winter competition in Baseball was started this year, under the guidance of Mr. Gillings.

Mr. Gillings proved himself an able coach, arranging all games and putting much time into the sport. A match was arranged between our "A" team and North Sydney, but was unfortunately cancelled. It was likely that a good game would have resulted.

Our "A" team was challenged by Newcastle Central School, but proved their superiority by winning 25 to 6. Wilson hit a home run, there were a few fielding errors, but on the whole we did well. This was our most important game.

Our last game was again a combined team from the school, with a few members of the Saturday Baseball Clubs, and once again we ran out the winners by 14 to 5. Sykes notched the only home run for our side. Owing to the fine combination of pitcher McConnell and first baseman Sykes, in the first two innings, none of the other team succeeded in reaching first base.

Our other match were against the school.

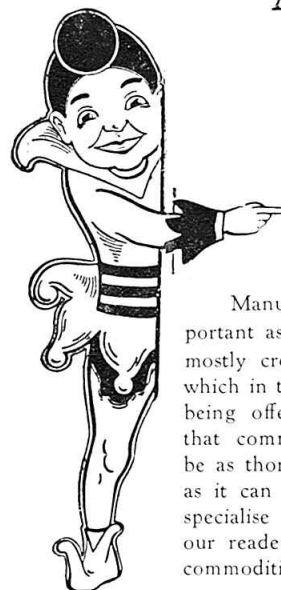
Several of our players are members of the Saturday competition teams, and Sykes succeeded in gaining a position in the Newcastle team versus the Rest.
