

GIRLS' EDUCATION REVIEW URGED

The basis of the education of girls should be re-examined to see whether it was not out of date, the Principal of the Newcastle Teachers' College (Mr. G. H. Duncan) said yesterday.

He was speaking at the annual speech day of Newcastle Girls' High School at Newcastle City Hall.

He said the re-examination should be made to try to decide whether bookish things and needlework were the only things girls could do.

Those things were good, but there were others. He did not know that it was necessary to include much home science in the education of girls, but there should be some. Maybe there should be some in the education of men.

The place girls were taking in modern society should be considered to decide whether girls should be educated for leadership.

Many parents said that it was no use their daughters going to the university because they would get married and their education would be wasted. That seemed a peculiar outlook.

Even if they did marry, would they not be better mothers for their education? It was good for women to have a profession to fall back on. Many a woman had had to become a breadwinner after her husband's death.

Mr. Duncan said he merely posed all these questions, and was not trying to answer them.

U.S. Schoolgirl

Mr. A. S. Madew, District Inspector of Schools, acted as chairman of the speech day. Dr. Joan Woodhill, as guest speaker, described the education of the American high school girl. She said that the American girl did not wear uniform. There were few who went through high school who did not learn typing. It was a great honour in the school to be known as a cheer leader.

Dr. Woodhill and Mrs. A. Chichester distributed prizes and certificates, and the President of the school's P. and C. Association (Mr. F. W. Nightingale) the trophies. The school captain (Alison Hunt) gave the sports report.

Delivering her report, the Headmistress (Miss S. D. Payn) said that in the 1951 Leaving Certificate examination 49 out of 53 candidates, or more than 92 per cent., were successful. In the Intermediate Certificate, 145 out of 147 candidates passed. The gross enrolment for 1952 was 675 compared with 647 in 1951.

University exhibitions were gained by J. Goffet, J. Morriss and J. Taylor; Commonwealth scholarships by M. Clatworthy, R. Brown-Parker, J. Campbell, M. Gardner, J. Goffet, A. Hamilton, J. Lynn, B. Manning, J. Morriss and J. Taylor, while J. Goffet won a £30 scholarship to the Women's College for the best Leaving Certificate Pass for a student attending that college. Seventeen girls also won scholarships to the Newcastle Teachers' College.
