COSTUMES: All Competitors MUST appear in correct House Colours.

START: All Competitors must be at the Starting Point before the First Heat is run. An announcement will be made before each event.

FALSE STARTS: Competitors shall be disqualified for Two (2) False Starts.

TRACKS: Competitors shall draw for tracks.

PLACE TOKEN: First, Blue; Second, Red; Third, Yellow; Fourth, Green; Fifth, White.

SEMI-FINALS AND FINALS—First and Second in each Heat to start in semi-finals and for finals unless stated otherwise.

ENCLOSURE: Only Competitors and officials shall be allowed in the Enclosure.

PROTESTS AND REFEREE: Protests shall be dealt with by the Referee and Committee. Protests must be lodged with the Referee within 15 minutes of the conclusion of an event.

AGE: A boy whose significant birthday falls on or before the 18th day of August, is Over Age for the Panel. No Competitor shall enter in corresponding events in more than one Age Panel.

POINT SCORES: Place Winners shall be awarded Points as follows: Championship Events and Year Relay: 1st, 16, 2nd 10; 3rd, 6; 4th, 4; 5th, 2; Championship Relays and Parade of Houses: 1st 32; 2nd, 20; 3rd, 12; 4th, 8. The winner of each heat will be awarded One Point to count in the House Point Score only.

HIGH JUMP: Senior: Compulsory Height 4ft. 6ins.; 3in. rises to 5ft. Junior: 4ft. 3in., 3in. rises to 4ft. 9ins. Under 14: 4ft., 3in. rises to 4ft. 3ins. Under 13: 3ft. 9ins., 3in. rises to 4ft.

After maximum heights, 1in. rises are to be made. In the event of a tie, the best record on a count back as used in the Empire Games shall decide the place winners.

BROAD JUMP AND HOP, STEP AND JUMP: Olympic conditions to govern. In the event of a tie, the count-back will be applied.

TROPHIES: The winning House shall receive the "Arthur" Shield to be held for 12 months. The "Winn" Cup shall be awarded for March Past. Pennants shall be awarded to Division Champions.

AGE CHAMPIONSHIPS shall be awarded on points gained in the Championship Events PREVIOUSLY nominated by the Competitor—Senior, 6 events; Under 16, 5 events; Under 15 14, 13, 4 events.

In the "Arthur" Shield, points gained in all events shall be included in the House Point Score.

In the "Winn" Cup Competition Points shall be awarded as for Championship Relay and included in the House Point Score.

PLACE-GETTERS shall receive from the Judges Coloured Tokens denoting success gained and MUST Parade, in order of winning, to the Recorders. Any place-getter failing to carry out this Rule shall be disqualified.
