1. Uniform

Box pleated tunic, black stockings, suspender belts - they're in fashion again!! Hats and gloves, PE tunic - potato sacks - especially over black stockings in winter! The 1st summer uniform designed for the school.

2. School Building

The front entrance, the "pews" in the foyer, the lino on the floor in the down stairs corridor, the hat rooms, the upstairs PE change room that became the art room, the pigeon loft used when painting stage scenery, the projection room at the back of the hall, the dressing rooms behind the stage, the hallowed garden plot.

Blackboards, operated like windows, the honour boards in the hall, the Joint Coal Board Plaque in the Hall, the writings on the toilet walls, pigeons dead and alive caught in the chimney outlets, ink powder to mix and ink wells, cleaners' cupboards in some rooms, lockers at the back of the classrooms, senior lockers in corridors, classroom fireplaces, double and single desks with lift up seats? screwed? to the floor.

3. School Routine

Using & filling fountain pens; getting coke for fires in winter; assemblies and sitting on lab. stools around the hall in 5th Year; suitcases to be carried in hand away from the wall when using the stairs; lining up at each entrance and waiting for the mistresses to let you in, not having to do this in 4th & 5th Year.
