



# Moment IN TIME

These Newcastle Boys High Cadet Corps were captured marching sometime in 1948, perhaps near the former school's location on Turton Road, Waratah.

The image was scanned from a photograph held by the University of Newcastle's Cultural Collections.

It was part of the Putting Names to Faces exhibition, which was held between September 17 and 20, 2007, in the University's Auchmuty Library

The exhibition of historic photographs of Novocastrians was collated from many personal and institutional archives.

Most of the subjects of the photographs were unidentified.

sometime in 1948. He agreed with Stephen Date, of Mayfield, who last week suggested the photograph may have been taken on Church Street, Mayfield, on the day of the funeral of teacher Clarrie Jacobs.

Mr Jacobs was also the officer in charge of the cadet corps.

The funeral was held at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Mayfield. Mr Date said, and the cadet corps formed a guard of honour after the service.

Mr Cowan said he was in the cadets from 1946 to 1949 and remembers marching from the school to the church.

"This photo was taken outside the church as we marched up Maitland Road," he said.

"The houses in the background are still recognisable today.

"I think I am in the photo - the corporal with the hat at a rakish angle in the second row behind the officer.

"It must have been a bad marching day if you notice how much out of step people are."
